4. **PUBLIC FORUM FOR QUESTIONS** -

No questions had been received from or were presented by members of the public.

5. **REPORTS FROM EXTERNAL ORGANISATIONS** -

- i) **Bluedot Festival** - Mr. J. Drape reported that preparations were progressing well for the 2019 event. Performances from high profile artists were planned for each day of the Festival, including a performance by the Halle Orchestra on the Thursday evening. Bluedot Festival has been awarded the Gold level of Attitude is Everything's Charter of Best Practice in recognition of efforts to improve the live music experience for deaf and disabled customers. There is likely to be a revised Premises Licence application submitted in the coming months to address capacity issues relating to total people onsite. Furthermore, there will be provision within the licence application to facilitate an event to mark the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the moon landings. The Festival site is also likely to be re-organised for future events due to changes in site and adjoining land availability. Members raised concerns about possible traffic implications should the site capacity increase and noise impact should events take place later than the current licence.

8:03p.m. - Mr. J. Drape & Mrs. C. Denton excused themselves from the meeting and left.

- ii) **Gawsworth & Chelford Wards Policing Team** - No Members of the Policing Team were present at the meeting, however, a written report had been provided which identified the following incidents: suspicious person at Jodrell Bank; Christmas tree on highway along A535; possible drink driver on A535; a road traffic collision on A535. Members noted that there had also been an accident on the A535 near the junction with Bomish Lane last week.
- iii) **Cheshire East Ward Member Cllr. L. Smetham** - Borough Councillor L. Smetham was not present at the meeting to report.
- iv) **Cheshire East Council - Presentation on Macclesfield Town Centre Strategic Regeneration Framework** - The Clerk reported that she had attended the meeting at which a presentation outlining the vision for Macclesfield was discussed. The current plans were ambitious and aimed to address issues relating to retail, housing, employment, topography, conservation areas, car parking and transport. It is anticipated that future town centre uses will have an increased leisure focus rather than purely retail.
